Dr. Anurag Srivastava, Principal, LBSGCM, completed an eight-week online NPTEL certification course (conducted through SWAYAM portal) in Accreditation and Outcome Based Learning, conducted by IIT, Kharagpur during August to October, 2025. The course is equivalent to an AICTE approved FDP.

The course aimed at the need of providing outcome-based learning opportunities to students, who will have to be prepared to face challenges such as globalization, changing demographics and technological advancements in the twenty-first century. Education structure should be outcome based so as to develop critical core competencies such as collaboration, digital literacy, critical thinking, problem-solving and self-learning.

The course in Accreditation and Outcome based Learning was designed to equip the learner with the tools and techniques for effective teaching and designing outcome-based curricula. It also focussed on enabling the participants to plan an outcome-based curriculum document to meet NBA and Washington Accord requirements.
